Texas Water Project director to speak March 10

Laura Marbury, P.G., director of the Texas Water Project of the Environmental Defense Fund, will speak on “Environmental Flow: The Relationship of Rivers, Playas and Wildlife” in a public meeting at 6:30 p.m. Tuesday, March 10, at the Southwest Branch Library, 6801 W. 45th. The program is cosponsored by the League of Women Voters and the Amarillo Public Library.

Marbury, of Austin, a hydrogeologist and registered Professional Geoscientist with the State of Texas, works to promote the longterm protection of groundwater and rural water resources in Texas and conducts research and education on a variety of water policy issues. She also manages the Texas Living Waters Project website, www.texaswatermatters.org, participates in the state’s regional water planning process and has co-authored several publications on groundwater conservation and marketing.

This program is part of a two-year study by the League of Women Voters on water resources in the Texas Panhandle and the outlook for their future viability, said Tonya Kleuskens, chair of the League’s Environment Committee. All interested residents of the Panhandle are invited to attend.
