## TESTIMONY LEAGUE OF WOMEN VOTERS OF TEXAS HOUSE GOVERNMENT TRANSPARENCY & OPERATIONS COMMITTEE

I am Cinde Weatherby, testifying as a member and on behalf of the League of Women Voters of Texas in OPPOSITION to HB 1530. We appreciate the opportunity to appear before you today. Thank you for allowing us to share the LWV-TX position on this bill.

The League is a big believer in using the best technology available for modernizing our voting system. We believe we are behind the rest of the nation in many ways, including the use of technology for voter registration and maintenance of the voter rolls. However, as long as there are any Texas citizens unable to use technology for doing that, we should always have back-up manual systems.

Just as we should never eliminate the handwritten voter registration card, we should not abandon printing polling locations in local newspapers. Even if voters are not newspaper subscribers, they are able to view them in local libraries or governmental buildings.

We appreciate each entity posting their polling places online on their respective websites and on the Secretary of State's website. The League especially applauds those counties that offer systems that allow users to look up their individual ballot on these websites, and encourage other counties to do the same.

It is estimated that up to six million Texans do not have internet service. While that number may be decreasing yearly, until we know that each Texan has the ability to see a list of voting places online, we oppose passage of this bill.

LWV-TX requests that you not approve HB 1530 for further consideration.
