I am Amanda Boudreault testifying as a member and on behalf of the League of Women Voters of Texas. We appreciate the opportunity to provide comments on **SB 258** relating to abortion and to speak to you today.

Women's health and access to comprehensive reproductive health services, including safe, legal abortions, are priority issues for the League and its members. Our position on this issue, like other League positions, is derived through a lengthy and thoughtful process involving the participation of 24 local leagues representing more than 5,000 members and supporters throughout the state of Texas.

This proposed bill would impose unnecessary prohibitions and requirements regarding disposition of embryonic and fetal tissue on women seeking abortions and on their physicians. These requirements have nothing to do with the safe practice of modern medicine. Healthcare providers such as hospitals and abortion clinics currently follow accepted standards for the sanitary disposal of medical waste including embryonic and fetal tissue. The addition of these non-medical requirements to current medical practice serve only to interfere with a patient's autonomy and decision making in her own medical care.

The League again thanks this Committee for the opportunity to express our views.
